LAROCHEMILLAY, YESTERDAY AND TODAY

Overlooking the Roman road linking Bibracte to the Loire Valley, this granite rock perched a hundred metres above the Roche valley was occupied in ancient times by a Gallo-Roman oppidum (like Mount Touleur). Mount Touleur). Its strategic position gave it its name: Rupes militis (the rock of the soldier). This picturesque village, one of the few in Morvan to have kept its medieval structure. lines its narrow streets with old houses from the 15th and 16th century houses. A castle, of very ancient origins, crowns the top of the rocky spur. Freed by their lord in the 13th century, thus becoming "the Millirupians obtained permission to permission to build a fortified enclosure in the 15th century.

the village is in the midst of its economic. In the 1950s, the village still had fifty or so craftsmen and tradesmen. The inhabitants of the village are keen to decorate the facade and front of their houses to remind them of the time when each of them housed a business or a craftsman's workshop, not forgetting the many cafés and inns. turn right (north-east) and go down the small path (common to the GR® 13) to the D 37; follow it on the left. At the bottom, pass in front of the Treux farm, cross the bridge over the Roche which undulates through the meadows and take the D27; turn right towards Château-Chinon for 80 m.

Opposite the house (old sign for Café Bouillot), turn left onto a path under the foliage.

It climbs towards Mont Touleur (582 m), then goes around it: in the undergrowth, turn right, then left and keep the direction on the flank until

you reach the D192; follow it to the left for 60 m.

Go up to the right on a wide track. In the wood, go straight on and, further on, leave another track on the right. You will then reach a fork in the road.

Leave the GR® 13 by turning left. After the pine forest, at the crossroads, turn right and then turn left in the direction of Fraichots

[high place of the resistance in Morvan]. Pass in front of the ruins and go

down the path to the monument.

Cross the D192 to take the path opposite. Go down to the houses of Le

Bouchet. Follow the small road on the left. It crosses a pass, then go to and reaches a crow's foot.

Turn right, cross the Maulot farm and continue on a dirt track. Go up into the undergrowth.

At the cross at Les Liards, go on the path slightly to the left of the cross. Exit

[St. Adelaide cross]. Turn left: go straight across a farmyard, in front of the chapel of Saint Gengoult

[patron des maris cocus...] and continue to the D 27. and take the Chemin de Vannoise to a crossroads.

Turn left into the village of Larochemillay

[beautiful bourgeois houses from the 15th to the 18th century, tower tower and rampart of the old medieval castle, château de la Roche (private)].
