

# Cité des Climats et vins de Bourgogne

A journey to discover the History of the Bourgogne vineyard

Introducing the History of Bourgogne wines, each *Cité* will cover the entire vineyard region from the towns of Chablis, Beaune and Mâcon.

Whatever your level of experience, from novice to enthusiast, it allows you to discover this great vineyard shaped by man for centuries through friendly, fun and educational experiences.

## Did you know?

In Bourgogne, a *Climat* designates a parcel of vines, delimited and named, often for centuries, harvested and vinified separately from a single grape variety. The resulting wine, with its **distinct character**, takes the name of the *Climat* from which it is made.

Three cultural and touristic sites

A *Cité* located in three emblematic towns


Each site will promote its viticultural area, its wines, its identity and will be an invitation to explore the vineyards.



## Chablis

Gateway to the Northern vineyards

Located in the heart of the village, a stone's throw from the vineyards, the *Cité* will be housed in an authentic and intimate medieval historic building: the **Petit Pontigny** cellar, a place highly charged with History, as it is **one of the monastic cradles** that shaped wine production in Bourgogne. It will promote the heritage and culture related to the world of vines and wine in the Bourgogne viticultural area and will highlight the wines of Northern Bourgogne : **Chablis, Grand Auxerrois, Châtillonnais.**



## Mâcon

Gateway to the Southern vineyards

In Mâcon, on the banks of the Saône river, in the heart of the cultural district, the *Cité* will integrate perfectly the urban space thanks to its strong signal shaped like a **wine wooden screw press**. The *Cité* will encourage the discovery of the area as well as the identity and practices of the entire vineyard will be highlighted while emphasizing those of Southern Bourgogne : **Côte Chalonnaise, Mâconnais.**



## Beaune

The heart of the Bourgogne wine-region

An architectural jewel inspired by a **vine tendril**, the *Cité* in Beaune will be located at the gateway to the city and will offer a panoramic view of the surrounding area.

The biggest of the three sites **will embody the History, expertise, and heritage of Bourgogne**, while highlighting the different particularities of the winegrowing areas (**Chablis, Grand Auxerrois, Châtillonnais, Côte de Nuits, Côte de Beaune, Côte Chalonnaise and Mâconnais**).

The Beaune site will be a **lively place committed to green tourism and sustainable practices**, and will host the main interpretation center for the *Climats du vignoble de Bourgogne*, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.
