Bioclimatic house

A few recommendations for your comfort

This house has been designed to have inertia: this means that its temperature varies little according to outside conditions. The house is ventilated by a centralised mechanical ventilation system coupled with a Canadian well (all the air in the house is changed every two hours), so you don't need to open the windows to ventilate, whether it's very hot or very cold.

The solar greenhouse heats the house very efficiently, but can also overheat it in summer if it is badly managed. Here are a few tips:

In summer



When the weather's fine, leave the large outside windows and upper vents open. This will prevent heat building up in the solar conservatory.

Leave the inside windows closed



- 1- To keep the heat out
- 2- To keep the flies out (and yes, this is the countryside).

When you go out on the terrace, always close the bay windows, because the heat comes in from the south-facing side of the terrace.

In the evening, to let the fresh air in, open the side windows to the east (bedroom side) and west (living room side): this will create a pleasant draught and the mosquito nets will protect you from mosquitoes and hornets (still in the country), unlike the south-facing windows.

Autumn, winter, spring



The weather is cooler, even colder, but the sun is out? Wait until the heat has accumulated in the solar greenhouse (outside windows and bellows closed) and then open the inside windows: the heat will then come in and warm the whole house. Even in very cold weather, this is enough heating as long as it's during the day.




You can also sit back and enjoy the sunshine in the solar greenhouse.



When the sun goes down, or if the weather is not sunny and you decide to light the stove, load it with a small amount of wood: the temperature rises very quickly! If the stove goes out at night, don't worry: if it's sunny the next day, you won't even have to turn it back on, and if it isn't, the wall behind the stove will have accumulated enough heat for you to be comfortable the next morning \bigcirc .
