Lanty Circuit de Gouttes Larges et Circuit du Chêne au Roy

Lanty is a small commune built on the southern flank of the Garenne hill, which at 372 m is the highest point in the southern Morvan. In Gallo-Roman times, Caesar set up a post here, which was replaced by the great battle of Bribracte with the Helvetii. Later, the post became the home of the Lords of Lanty. More than a century and a half ago, the village had more than 600 inhabitants and its vocation was not livestock farming but winegrowing. The Lanty Winegrowers' Brotherhood was renowned and had over 200 members.

In 1999, the commune had just 110 inhabitants spread over 1,208 hectares.

Most of the population is retired. The main economic activity is cattle rearing (there is also a pedigree dog breeder). Following the closure of the schools, Lanty has developed 4 3-star guest rooms and a self-catering cottage.

Chêne au Roy trail

8.5 km - 2h10 - signposted in blue

Start From the church square, take the D515 for 500 m towards LUZY.

1 At the calvary, take the track on the left, then turn left again, skirting the forest and heading up towards "La Mazille".

2 At the crossroads, fork right as far as "Les Gris".

3 In the hamlet, turn left to join the "voix communale des champclins".

4 Cross the road and go up through the woods to "Chêne au Roy".

6 Take the road to the right for 50 m, then turn left. Follow the track and go straight ahead at the crossroads.

7 Join the Champ Simonet then the road.

8 At "Bost", turn left into the market town of Rémilly.

9 In Rémilly, head towards the cemetery then turn left towards "Les Brosses". Follow the double yellow-blue signs to Lanty.
