## GETTING HERE

**From Paris or Lyons:** A6 motorway, Pouilly-en-Auxois exit.

**From Dijon:** A38 motorway, Somberton exit, then road D977bis.

**By bike:** take the Burgundy Canal cycle path and exit at La Rèpe - between Le Pont de Bois and Vandenesse-en-Auxois - and continue to the castle.

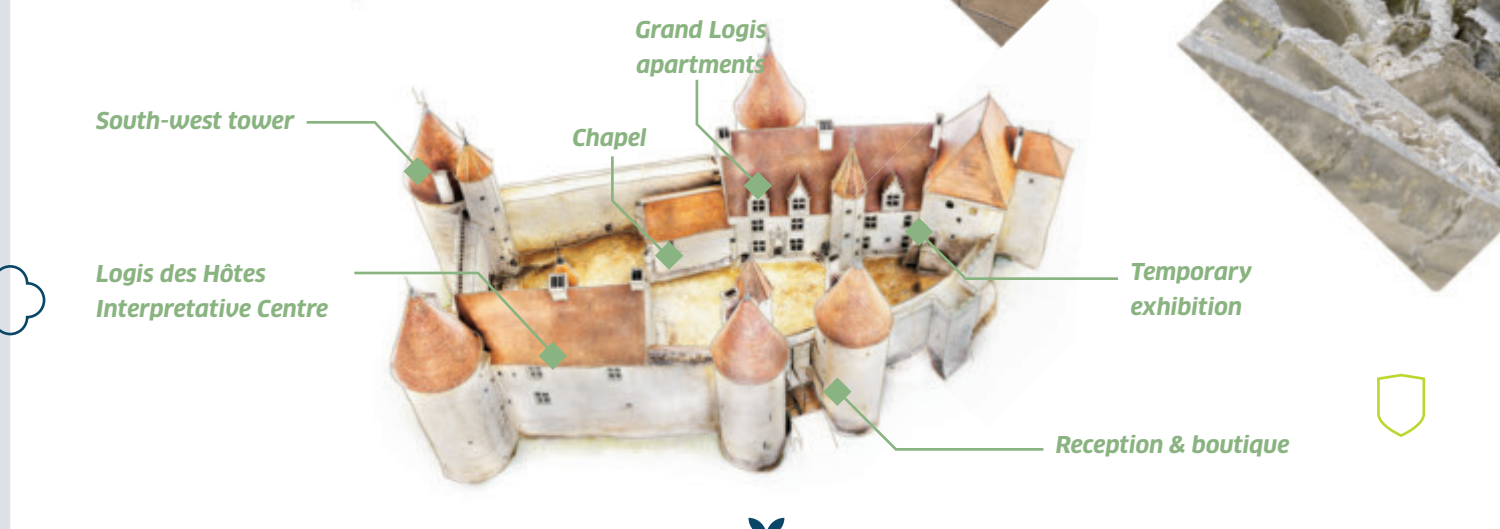

# Welcome to an exceptional medieval castle

The fortress of Châteauneuf is one of the last remaining vestiges of 15th century medieval architecture, rarely seen in such a good state of repair. In the 15th century, Châteauneuf Castle featured some magnificent decorative architecture. These features can still be seen, enhanced by a succession of improvements carried out over the centuries.

Since 2008 the castle has belonged to the Regional Council who are continuing restoration work to make it the key showpiece in a built heritage & culture project. Besides being a major tourist attraction, the castle is rooted in the collective memory of our region and is part of its very identity.

Entering the enclosure is like stepping into history!

**The Logis des Hôtes** (guest quarters) which were built by Philippe Pot during the 15th century, have been renovated and now house **an interpretative centre**. Stimulate your senses on an exploration of the castle's history through a unique, beautifully arranged tour.

**In the chapel**, some outstanding murals can be seen, the work of a great painter who belonged to the Burgundy Dukes' entourage.



**The furnished apartments of the Grand Logis** (main living quarters) offer a glimpse of the way of life in a medieval castle under the Ancien Régime.

They feature **a beautiful collection of 17th-century tapestries** depicting the life of Moses.

Don't forget to visit **the gardens of medieval inspiration, the castle attic**, etc.
