

A walk suggested by Acscpf

Starting from the main car park at the foot of the town hall, discover the village wash house. After crossing the Ouanne, a country walk begins along narrow roads leading to local hamlets and fairly well-shaded paths.

## Description

A car park located at the foot of the village hall and the village community hall is available for parking.

**(S/E)** From the end of the car park, facing the hedge, head to the right. Go down the few steps leading to the wash house, then head back up the tarmac road. Turn left, cross the Ouanne on the bridge and continue along this road until you reach a crossroads.

**(1)** Head towards La Jaunière - Bel-Air on the left. Pass the track leading to the farm and you'll come to the edge of a wood. Turn right to reach the sharp bend in the road.

**(2)** Leave this road and head straight along the path. You will reach a first junction with a tree in the middle of the path.

**(3)** Turn right onto a path lined with hedges. You will come out onto a road.









**(4)** Take it to the right and follow it to the next junction (there is a Stop sign on this road).

**(5)** Turn left, walk for about twenty metres until you find, between the two houses, a path flanked by hedges. After a sharp bend, the path descends onto a service road.

**(6)** Head right and, at the next junction, take the road on the left.

**(1)** Go straight on at the junction and return to the village via the same route as on the way out **(S/E)**.

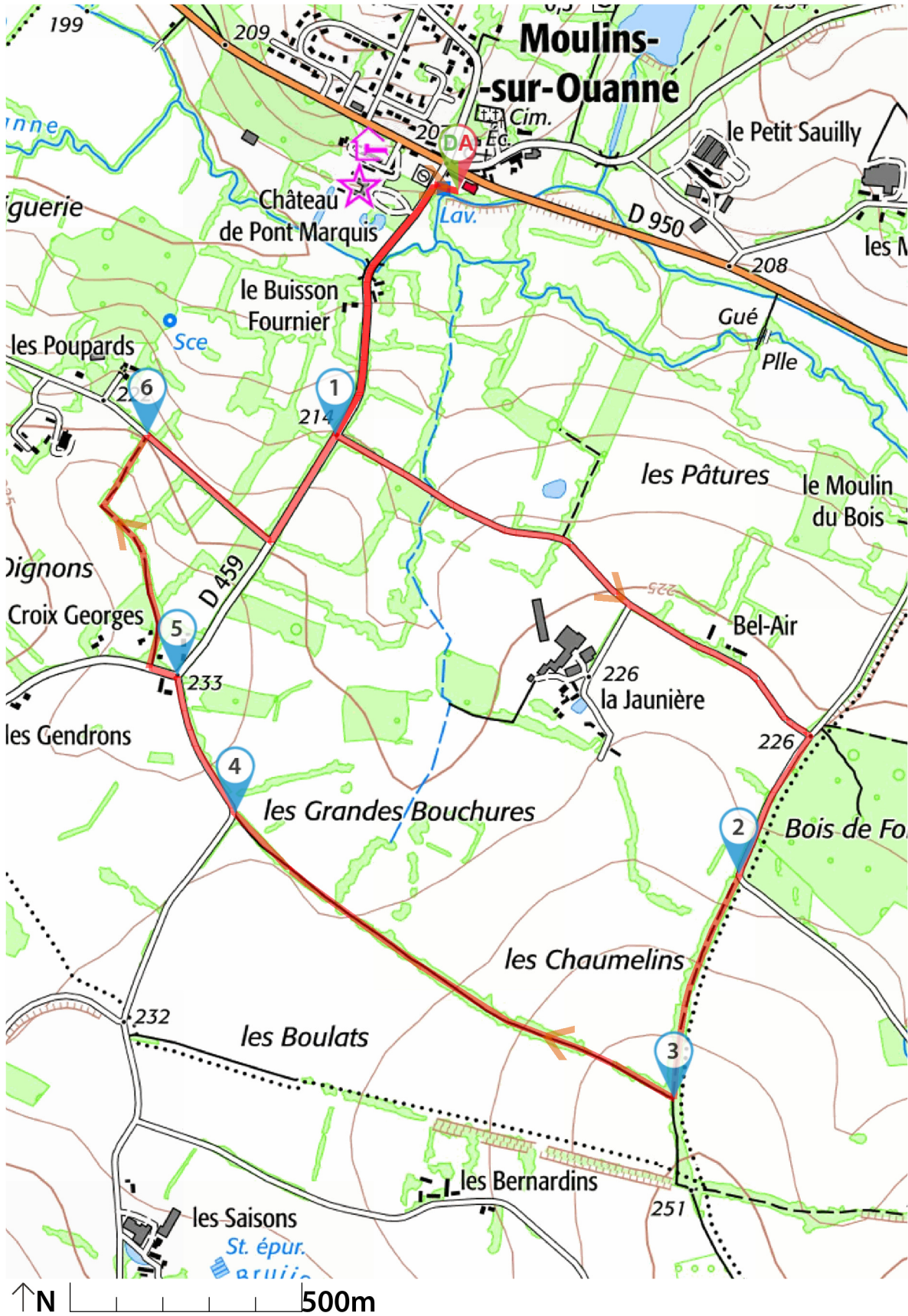

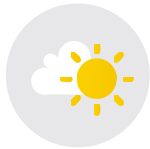

## Before the walk



### CHOOSE YOUR WALK CAREFULLY

by matching its difficulty and duration to your skill and physical ability.



### CHECK THE WEATHER FORECAST

and look for other important information, such as snow, temperature, tide times, wind speed, fire risks, etc.



### BE PROPERLY PREPARED

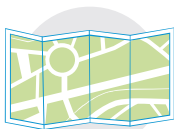
by taking suitable equipment with you, such as whistle, first-aid kit, appropriate clothing and something to eat and drink.



### LET SOMEONE KNOW

where you will be walking.

## During the walk



### STAY ON THE PATH

Follow local signs and keep to marked paths unless wider access is available.



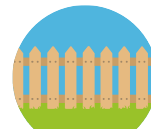
### RESPECT THE COUNTRYSIDE

by not damaging fences, fields and crops and not picking fruit or vegetables..



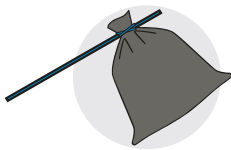
### RESPECT LOCAL RESTRICTIONS

such as bans on fires, barbecues, camping, fishing, swimming, etc.



### LEAVE GATES AS YOU FIND THEM

be cautious of farm animals : try to go around, not through herds or flocks.



### TAKE YOUR RUBBISH HOME

and do not leave any trace of your journey except your footprint.



### DON'T MAKE LOTS OF NOISE

and do be respectful and courteous to people along the route.



### KEEP YOUR DOG ON LEAD

and have it close to you at every crossroads of other users. Bag and bin its dog poo. Walking with a dog is not recommended on routes where there are farm animals.



### THE COUNTRYSIDE IS A LIVING ENVIRONMENT

that evolves with time. Waling is an adventure and there are risks associated with it. Be responsible, and know when it is better to give up and turn around than get into danger.
